Strategic Plan key goals:

Deliver high quality programs and partnerships that meet the needs of our children, youth and their families:

- 🐳 We celebrated the transition of the School Based Rehabilitation program to our Centre.
- 🐳 Approval was received to provide a Centre based Autism Diagnostic Clinic.

Ensure optimal infrastructure to support our programs:


- Land for a new Centre was secured in support of our Capital Building project.







2019 MOTHER'S DAY CAMPAIGN \$33,570 RAISED!


