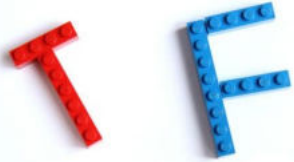




Playing with Lego encourages Fine Motor Development, Bilateral Integration, Sensory Skills, and Play Skills!

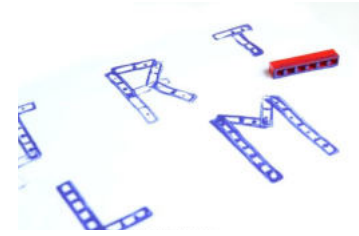
Here are some fun activities you can try at home.

LEGO
LETTER STAMPS



Lego Letter Stamps

Gently dip long and single width blocks in paint, to form upper and lower case letters. Helps children practice letter identification and letter formation.



Build.
Build letters out of Lego blocks.



Trace.
Trace the letter below the Lego model.



Print.
Practice printing the letter on your own.

Match, Find & Copy



Use a permanent marker* to print Uppercase Letters and/or Lowercase letters on Lego bricks (one letter per brick).

Then try:

- Putting the letters in alphabetical order
- Matching Uppercase to Lowercase
- Choosing a brick at random to decide what letter to practice building, tracing, or printing
- Choosing a brick at random and then finding or naming something else that starts with that letter

*Use a whiteboard marker if you don't want the letters to be permanent, but it will smear and stain hands easily

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ADDING & SUBTRACTING with LEGOS



Build a stack of Legos 10 or more blocks high. Use a dry erase marker* to write numbers right on the blocks.

Then try:

- Putting the numbers in the correct order
- Counting forwards and backwards out loud
- Practice addition and subtraction as you add and remove blocks

* dry erase should wipe off Lego bricks cleanly

Other Ideas:

- Sort bricks by size, shape, and colour
- Use tweezers to pick bricks up and move them between containers
- Practice moving bricks fingertips to palm, and palm to fingertips
- Create and imitate repeating patterns of bricks
- Play with Lego while lying on your stomach
- Create simple structures and have your child try to duplicate them
