75 Years and Going Strong!

The Children's Treatment Centre of Chatham-Kent has been working with incredible youth and families for 75 years!

The family culture and community support needed to establish our Centre in 1948 continues to be seen in abundance today with input into design and planning for our exciting new build. The state-of-the-art facility will provide new opportunities and enable us to meet the programming needs of our children, youth and families.

IMPACT REPORT

While new build planning including site readiness, design development and preparation for construction have been the prime focus this year, numerous additional accomplishments were realized. Staff participated in multiple Indigenous Cultural education opportunities to support the delivery of culturally safe services. SmartStart Hub services were launched in alignment with the provincial directive to provide an open door to all family inquiries concerning development. An Entry to School program was provided for eligible clients in the Ontario Autism Program to help make the transition into school successful. Again under provincial guidance, families now have the option to purchase behavior services. A job skills program for youth was introduced to provide opportunities for building job readiness. In addition new business processes were introduced including plans for a new web site, additional clinical manager position and the selection of a new client electronic record for future family portal access.



As part of our 75th year our Board has looked forward and is pleased to announce our new strategic plan to guide our work going forward. Our Vision is "Amazing Kids Today, enriching our community tomorrow", and our Mission is "To enable children, youth and their families to live fulfilling lives, with specialized programs and services that support their strengths and address their unique needs". We are guided by our Values including: Family, Inclusion, Team and Safety, and look forward to working on our key Strategic Goals of Collaborative Leadership, Evidence Informed Client Based Services, Strong Resilient Organization and Effective Resource Management.

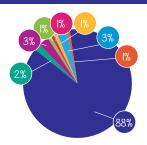

Registered Social Workers work with children, youth and their families to build social skills, promote positive self-esteem and help with the transition into adulthood, including pursuing postsecondary education, independent living, and finding employment or volunteer opportunities

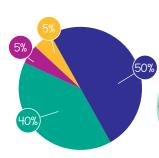
MUSIC THERAPY

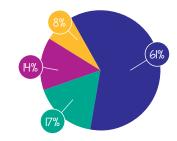
